



Graduate Survey Report

2022-2023 Academic Year

Prepared by the Office of Admissions & Student Services

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Summary

This report details the results of the 2023 Graduate Survey. This survey is administered at the end of each academic year to all students graduating in that year and serves as an important measure of student satisfaction. The survey includes a number of the College's Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and is evaluated as part of the College's strategic planning process.

Methodology

This year, the College used a revised version of the Graduate Survey with 26 questions. The COVID-19 related questions, which were added in 2020 were removed. However, more detailed questions regarding the graduate's planned college major and profession were included. It asks graduates about their experiences at the College, but also references their backgrounds, and future plans. Revisions were made jointly by the Chief Student Affairs Officer and Director of Institutional Effectiveness with feedback from other staff members as well as a number of students.

The 2023 Graduate Survey was administered via Survey Monkey to all 367 graduates of the Class of 2023, with a 96% response rate.

Analysis

Survey results were, on the whole, very positive and provided insight into the student population. Students indicated a high level of support and awareness regarding most aspects of the College. The following is a question by question analysis of the results followed by graphical representation of the data and individual responses to the open ended questions:

- Q1: 91.22% of graduates indicated they will be attending a four-year college or university and 7.08% plan on attending a two-year college immediately following their graduation from Doral College. While 1.13% of graduates plan to attend an academic institution in the future but not immediately. This is consistent with the results of the last five years, further supporting the understanding that the College's student population is more concerned with pursuing continued postsecondary study than employment opportunities.
- Q2: 49.58% of graduates indicated they had applied to more than four colleges, universities, or technical schools to continue their academic careers compared with 23.23% applying to 3-4 schools, and 25.5% applying to 1-2 schools. There is a slight decrease in the percentage of students applying to more than four schools when compared with last year's graduates.
- Q3: 33.31% of graduates indicated they had been accepted to more than four colleges, universities, or technical schools in order to continue their academic careers compared with 27.26% accepted to 3-4 schools, and 37.11% accepted to 1-2 schools. Approximately 10% fewer graduates than last year indicated they had been accepted to more than four institutions. However, with the increase in class size, that is not alarming, but will be monitored next year. Results still indicate the majority of graduates are competitive candidates for continued postsecondary study and have a number of options available to them.
- Q4: Regarding how many scholarship dollars they had been offered, 19.55% of graduates indicated they had been offered \$75,000 or more, 8.78% had been offered between \$74,999-\$50,000, 16.15% had been offered between \$49,000-\$25,000, 33.14% had been offered less than \$24,999, and 22.38% indicated they had been offered no scholarship dollars. When compared with last year's results, there was a slight decrease in the percentage of graduates receiving a higher number of dollars. Also compared to last year's graduates a higher percentage reported being offered no scholarship dollars. The graduates were only asked if they received scholarship dollars, not if they applied for scholarships. These results indicate the majority of graduates are able to obtain financial assistance to help them fund continued study.

- Q5: Concerning employment regardless of continued education, the majority of graduates (63.32%), indicated they intend to look for part-time employment, while 18.98% intend to look for full-time employment. 25.78 % of graduates intend to continue employment currently held, whether part-time or full-time, and 12.75% have no plans for employment. Similar to last year, the majority of students have plans to work part time, and the overall majority indicate plans to work in some capacity.
- Q6: This question was revised for the 2023 survey to reflect open ended responses to a survey administered to this population at the beginning of the Fall 2022 semester. The categories were narrowed down to 76 specific careers and career fields. While this is tedious, it helps give Doral College insight into the academic needs of current and future students. The responses can also assist in planning for new program offerings. Regarding future careers, graduates indicated interest in a wide variety of fields. The most popular responses include medicine and health related professions (8.78%), nursing (8.22%), biology (7.08%), and Psychology (5.95%). It is worth noting that there were quite a few specific choices related to these selections. Some students (2.83%) did respond that they were undecided. Results also indicate the majority of graduates have very specific plans for their future professional life.
- Q7: This question asked graduates to indicate the highest degree they intend to earn. An impressive 32.29% indicated plans to earn a doctorate or medical doctorate degree. The majority of graduates (39.38) plan on earning a master's degree. A bachelor's degree was the fourth most popular option at 13.88%. A law degree (8.22 %) was also popular. These results reflect the quality of the graduating class and the extent of their academic plans.
- Q8: Regarding the quality of instruction, 81.3% of students indicated their instructors taught either extremely or very well, which was a slight increase from last year. Only five students selected the "not so well" and one student selected the "not at all well" option. These results are similar to last year's and indicate the College is maintaining a quality faculty.
- Q9: This multi-part question asked students to indicated how well the College prepared them for attaining each of the Associate in Arts degree's program outcomes. Results, which reflect an increase in a positive response for each outcome, strongly indicate the program is succeeding in preparing graduates to excel in each of the program outcomes, as follows:
 - Reading effectively (84.42% said "very well" or "well")
 - Writing effectively (83.28% said "very well" or "well")
 - Speaking effectively (80.17% said "very well" or "well")
 - Thinking critically (84.99% said "very well" or "well")
 - Understanding human behavior, institutions, and culture (83.29% said "very well" or "well")
 - Understanding and applying mathematical principles and methods (79.04% said "very well" or "well")
 - Understanding and applying scientific principles and methods (83% said "very well" or "well")
 - Finding, evaluating, organizing, and using information effectively (89.84% said "very well" or "well")
- Q10: 43.06% of students indicated the Office of Admissions & Student Services was "Extremely useful" or "Very useful" in helping them with their post-graduation plans, with approximately 38.24% indicating they had not made use of the services. Only eight students indicated they found the services to be only slightly helpful, and five students indicated the services were not at all helpful. This is similar to last year, and though it indicates graduates are not dissatisfied with student services, it also means fewer are using the services. The decrease in the percentage indicating the usefulness correlates with the increase in the percentage of graduates indicating they had not made use of the service.
- Q11: This multi-part question addressed satisfaction with the College's admissions and registration processes. Regarding admissions, 86.97% of graduates indicated they were either "very satisfied" or "satisfied". Regarding registration, 87.46% of graduates indicated they were either "very satisfied" or "satisfied. A small percentage indicated dissatisfied (12.18%) and very dissatisfied (.28%) with the admissions process corresponding with a small percentage (11.68%) responding dissatisfied and very dissatisfied (.28%). This is a slight increase from last year. The remaining percentage of students indicated neither satisfied nor dissatisfied in both categories.
- Q12: Regarding LIRN (the online library) 70.82% of graduates indicated they were either "very satisfied" or "satisfied"
- Q13: 98.3% of graduates indicated they achieved, or will have achieved upon completing their studies, the goals they had when they started the course or program, which is a slight increase from last year. This question indicates the College is doing an excellent job of helping graduates meet their personal goals.
- Q14: 97.73% of graduates indicated they were satisfied with their studies with the College. Note: only eight students stated they were dissatisfied with their studies.

- Q15: 95.75% of graduates indicated they would recommend the College to a friend, which is a slight increase from last year.
- Q16 53.54% of graduates estimated their Doral College grade point average between 3.5-3.99, 20.40% selected 4.0 and the lowest range selected was 2.0-2.99. This indicates the majority of graduates felt confident in their performance in the College.
- Q17 53.82% of graduates indicated that at least one parent had attended college, which is a slight decrease from last year, which was 56.77%
- Q18 The majority (67.42%) of graduates indicated they receive free or reduced lunch at their home high school, evidence that Doral College continues to serve “at-risk” populations.
- Q19: This open-ended question asked graduates to identify their most favorite experiences at the College. Students listed many different experiences including:
 - Earning their Associate in Arts degree.
 - Graduation
 - Experiencing college classes while in high school
 - Faculty
 - Classes
 - Online learning environment

- Q20 This open-ended question asked graduates to identify their least favorite experiences at the College. Students listed several different experiences including:
 - Course load and workload
 - Lack of instructor response
 - Technical issues with Canvas and Honor Lock, which were introduced for the 2022-2023 academic year
 - Some students cited individual classes

- Q21 This open-ended question asked graduates to indicate how the program might be improved. Many students said the College did not need to be improved and was enjoyable as is. Others made suggestions including:
 - More communication opportunities between students as well as students and faculty
 - Improved communication between instructors and students.
 - More activities allowing dual enrollment students from different high schools to interact.
 - Many responses were “not applicable” or “none”.

- Q22: The majority, 58.25%, indicated they would not be interested in appearing in a Doral College Alumni directory.
- Q23 A majority, 75.16%, indicated they would not be interested in joining a Doral College Alumni Association.
- Q24 The majority, 75.57%, indicated they would not be interested in learning about a leadership position in an alumni association.
- Q25 Similar to last year’s responses, 37.34% responded “yes” and 62.66% responded no regarding attending activities hosted by the alumni association.

Use of Results

It is worth noting that the 2023 Graduate Survey was completed by the largest graduating class to date with a little over 100 more graduates than in 2022. There were questions as to whether or not this would result in a noticeable change in results compared to previous years. Overall, this year's results are overwhelmingly positive, following previous years, and indicate the majority of graduates enjoyed a high level of satisfaction with the College with very few, if any, exceptions.

One of the more notable differences is the 10% decrease in students being accepted to four or more postsecondary institutions. However, this correlates with the decrease in students applying to four or more institutions. As the majority of students are dual enrollment, they receive advice on applying to the next postsecondary institution from both the high school guidance counselor and the Doral College Director of Advising and Student Services. The Office of Student Affairs will explore collaborative initiatives with dual enrollment high school counselors.

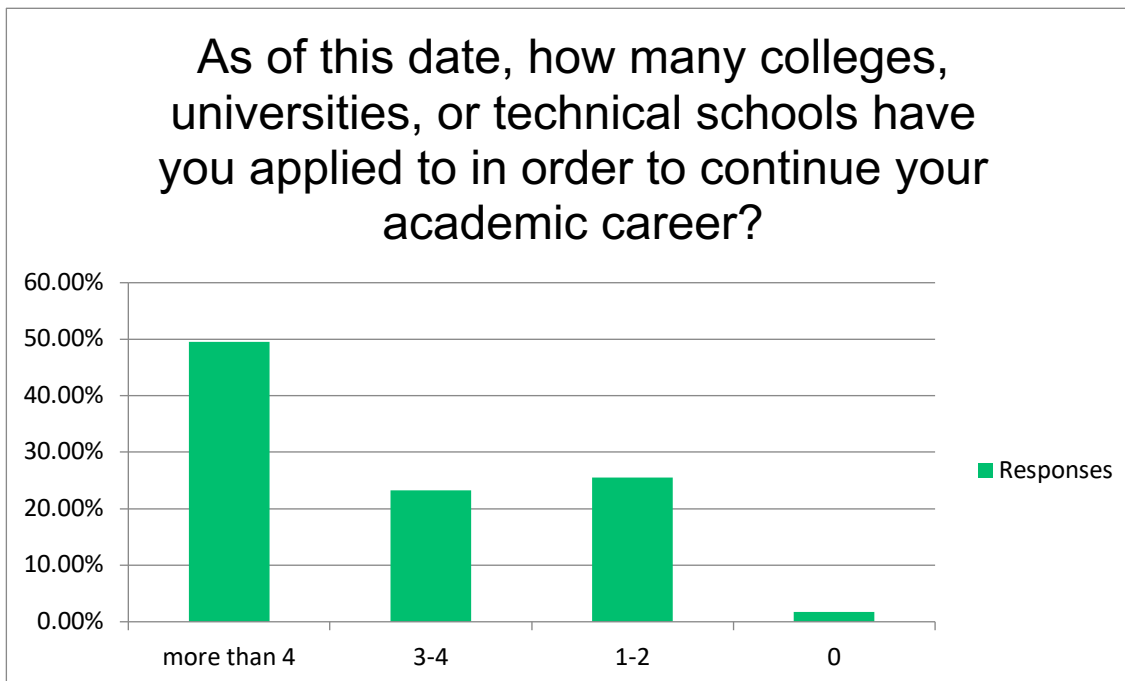
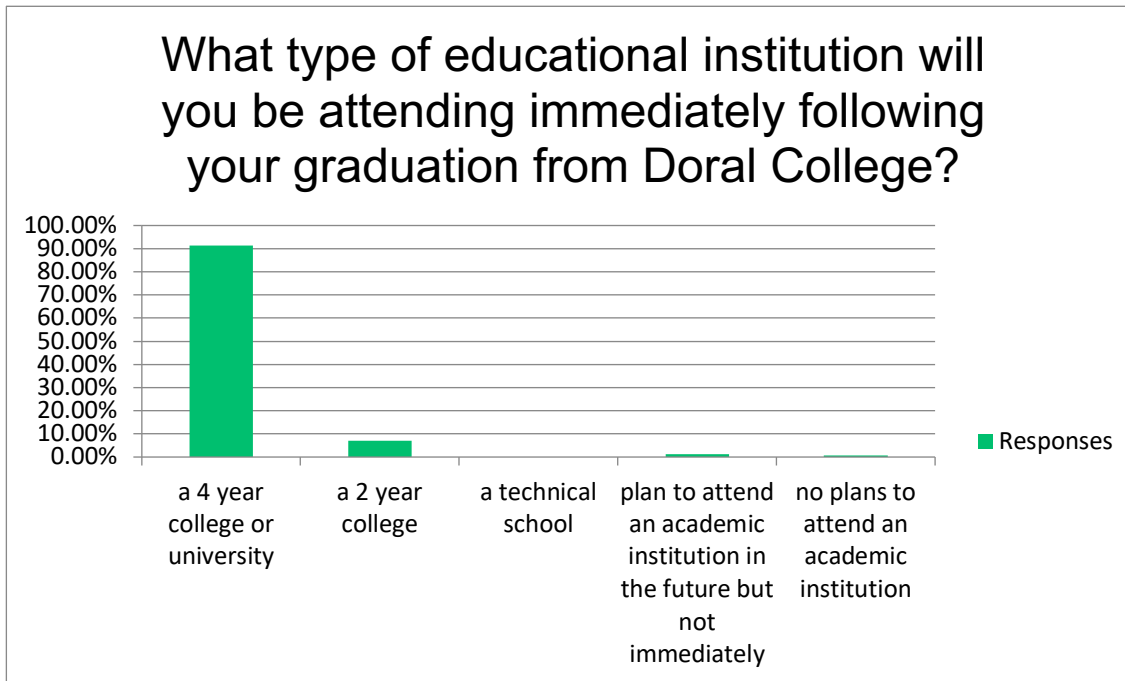
The revision of the question regarding future career plans gives the College insight into new courses that may be beneficial. The most popular professions were related to healthcare and biological sciences. As Doral College looks to increase course offerings, it will be beneficial to research common lower-level prerequisites for these fields and create a course creation schedule for these courses. This can reduce the number of prerequisites students will have to complete in their bachelor's program.

The percentage increase in attainment of all program outcomes is significant. The Academic Department has made a concerted effort to better document alignment with program level outcomes within the course content over the past few years. Faculty also upload a report to Air Table at the completion of each semester tracking program level outcome attainment at the course level. It is assumed that a more direct focus on program outcomes at the course level has led to this significant increase.

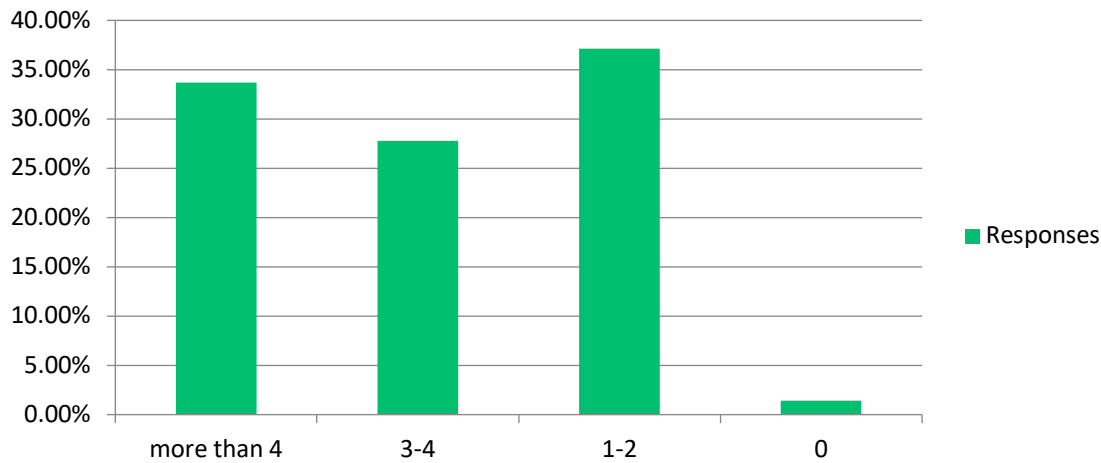
Of the students making use of services offered by the Office of Admissions and Student Services, the majority of respondents were satisfied. Additionally, the majority of respondents were satisfied with admissions and registration. Even though these results are very positive, the office is always investigating ways to offer more services and make the admissions and registration process easier for students and more streamlined administratively.

Once again over 95% of the students responded that they achieved their goals, were happy with their studies, and would recommend Doral College to a friend. This is a testament to the team effort to ensure a valuable experience with a mix of quality academics and services.

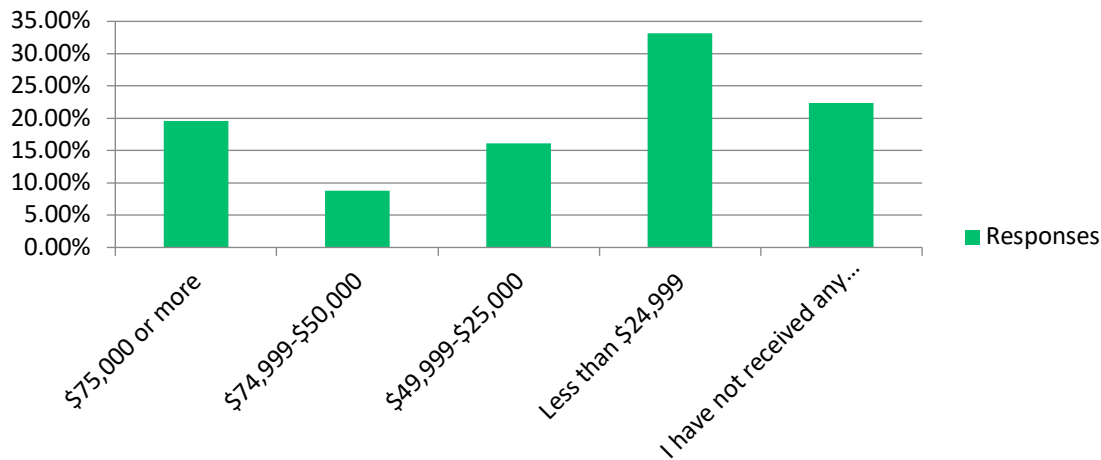
Graphical Representation of the Data



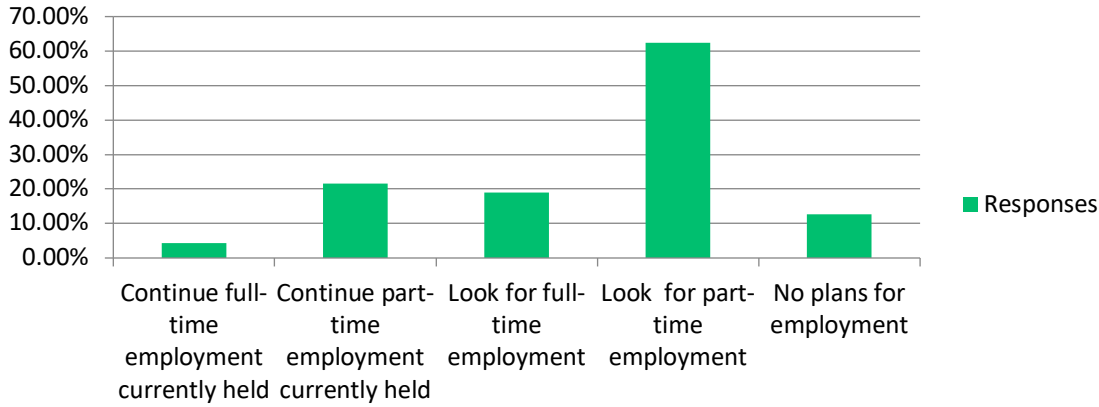
As of this date, how many colleges, universities, or technical schools have you been accepted to?



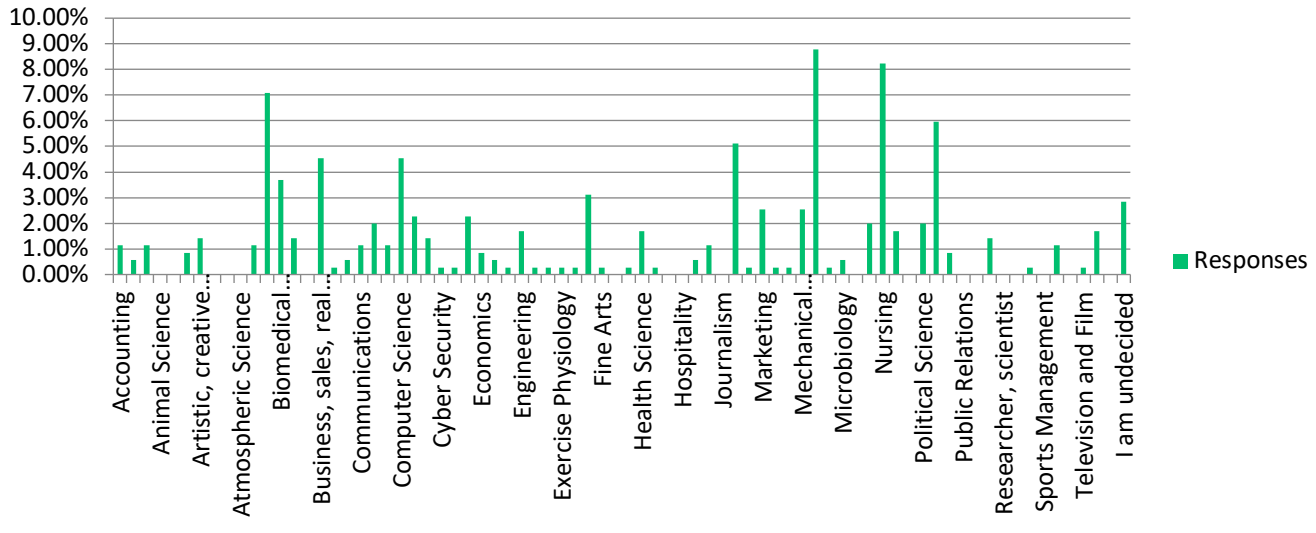
As of this date, approximately how many scholarship dollars have you been offered (from all revenue sources and schools)?



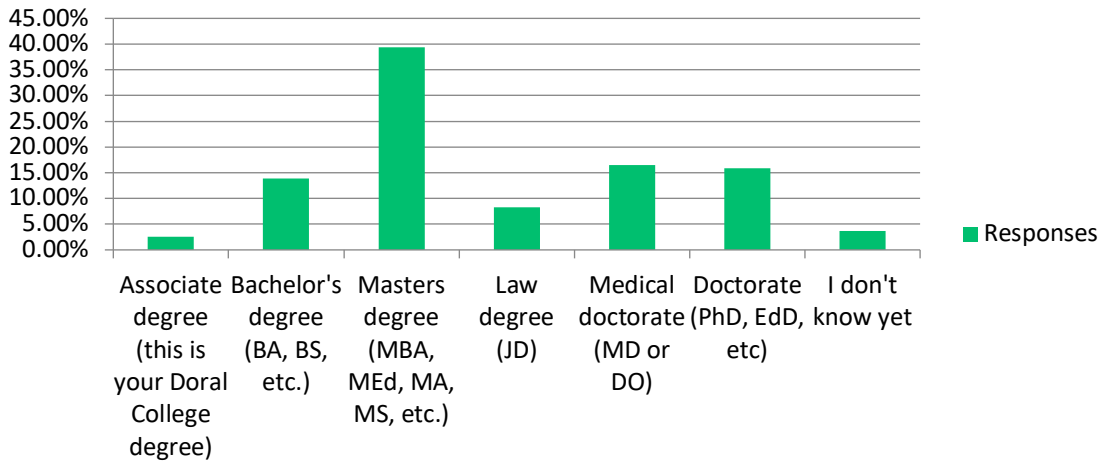
Upon graduation from Doral College, whether you continue your education or not, what are your immediate plans for employment? Mark as many as apply.



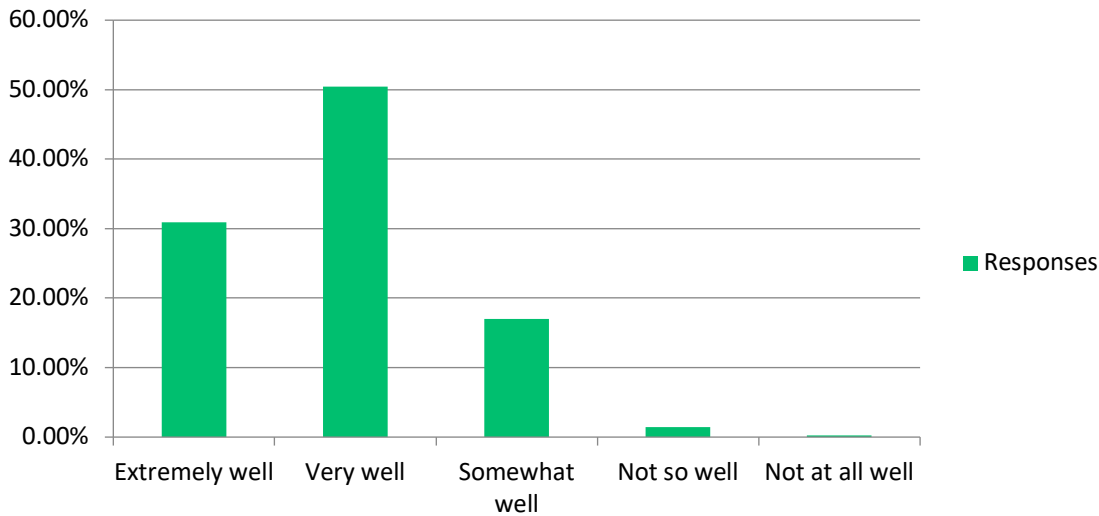
What career do you plan to pursue after you have completed your education?



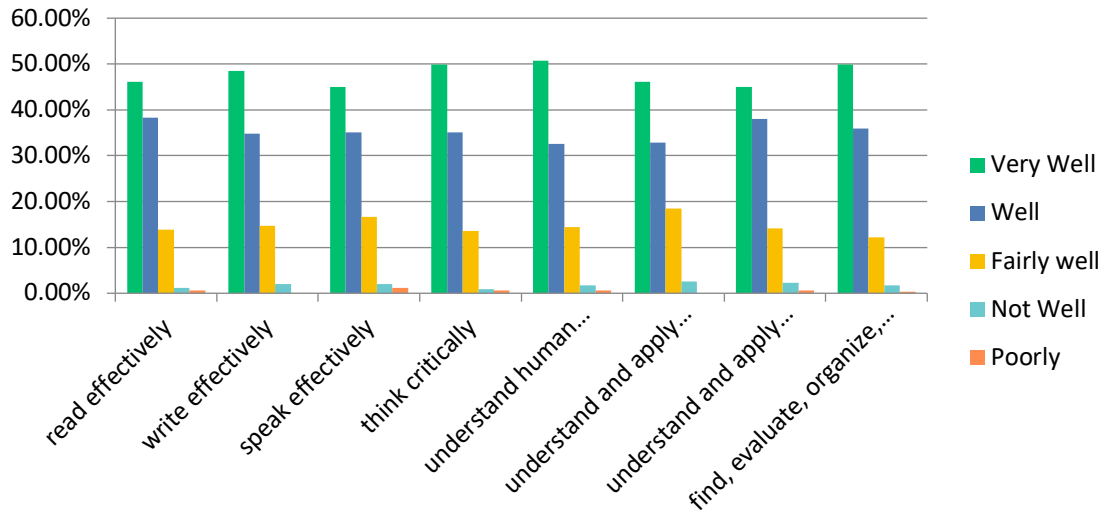
What is the HIGHEST academic degree or credential that you plan to eventually earn?



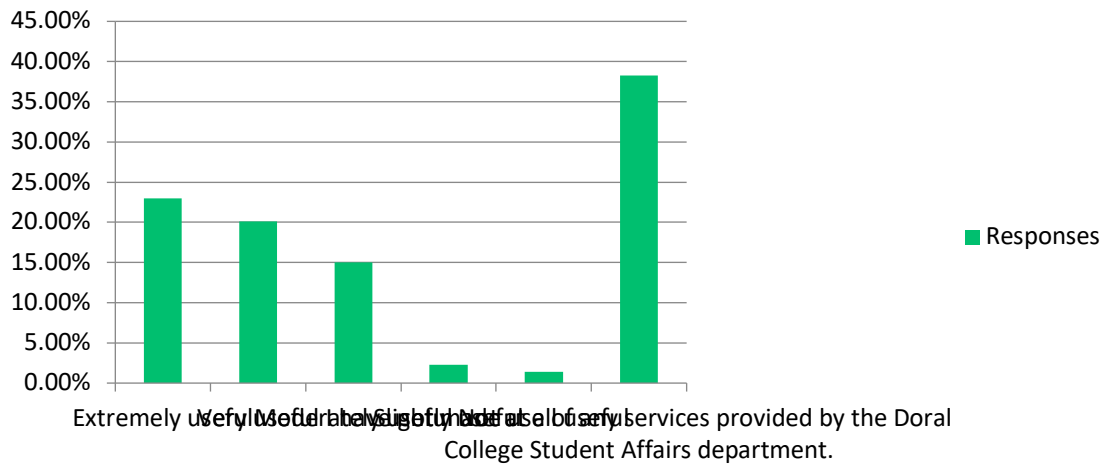
How well do your Doral College instructors teach?



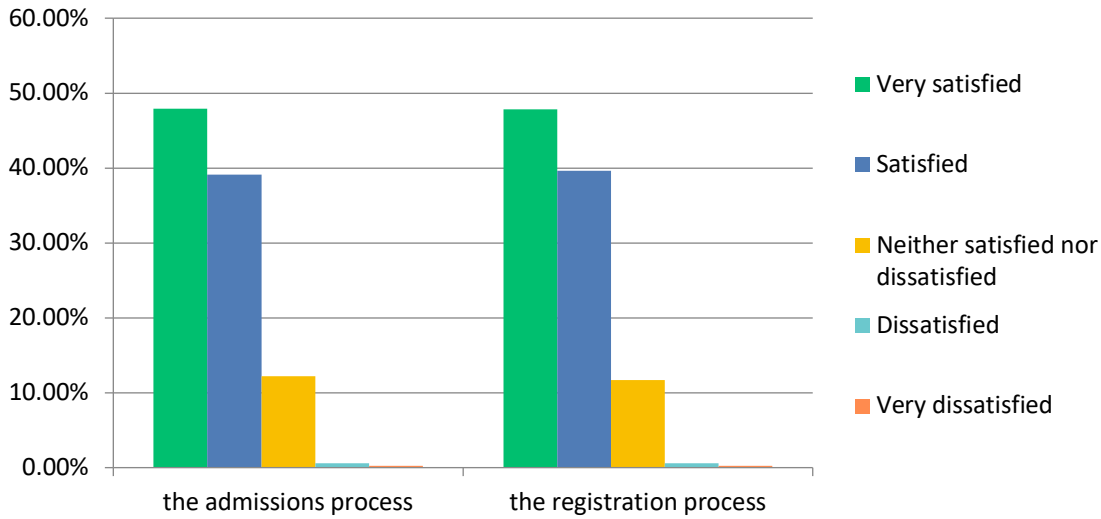
How well did Doral College prepare you to:



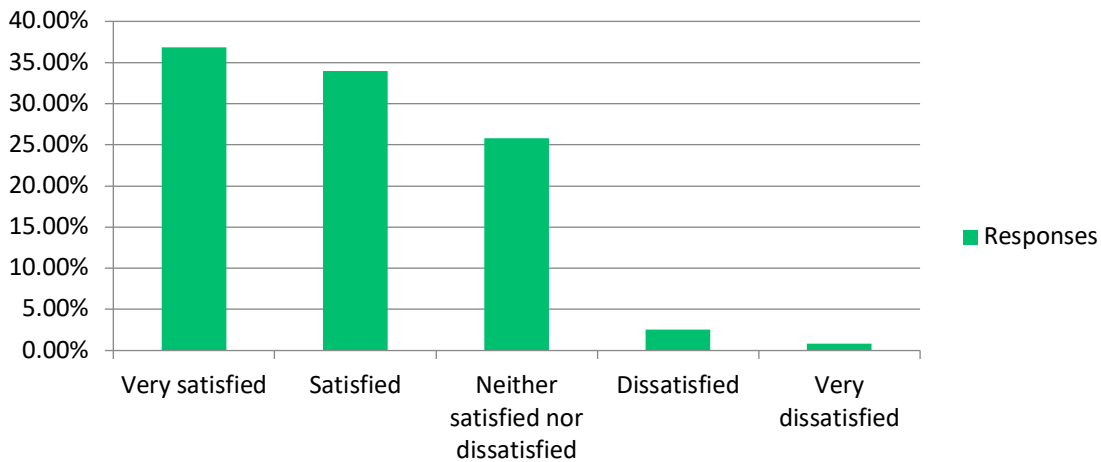
How useful was the Student Affairs department in helping you with your post-graduation plans?



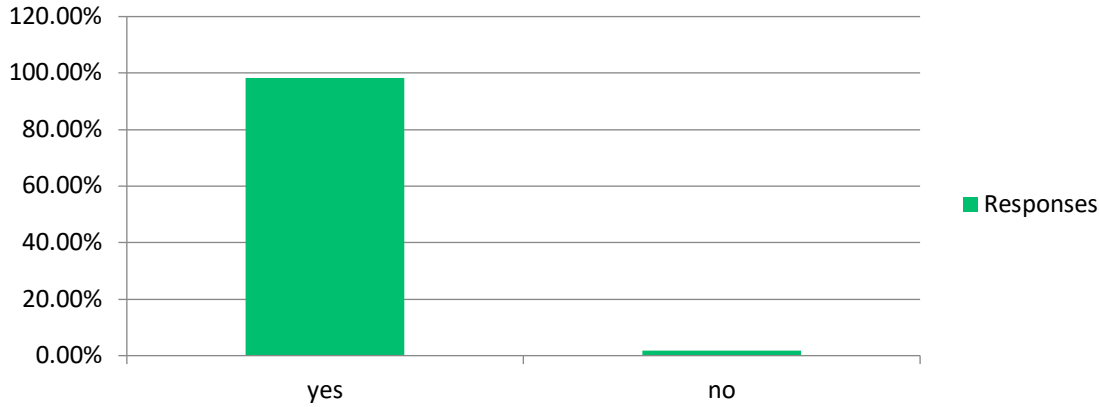
How satisfied are you with the following processes?



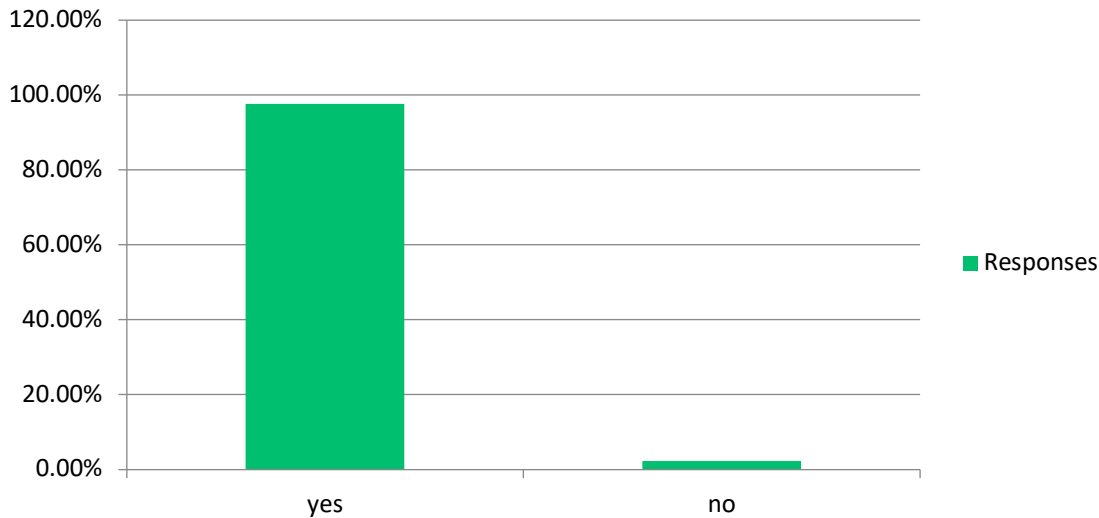
How satisfied were you with Doral College's learning resource databases (i.e. JSTOR, Gale) and library?



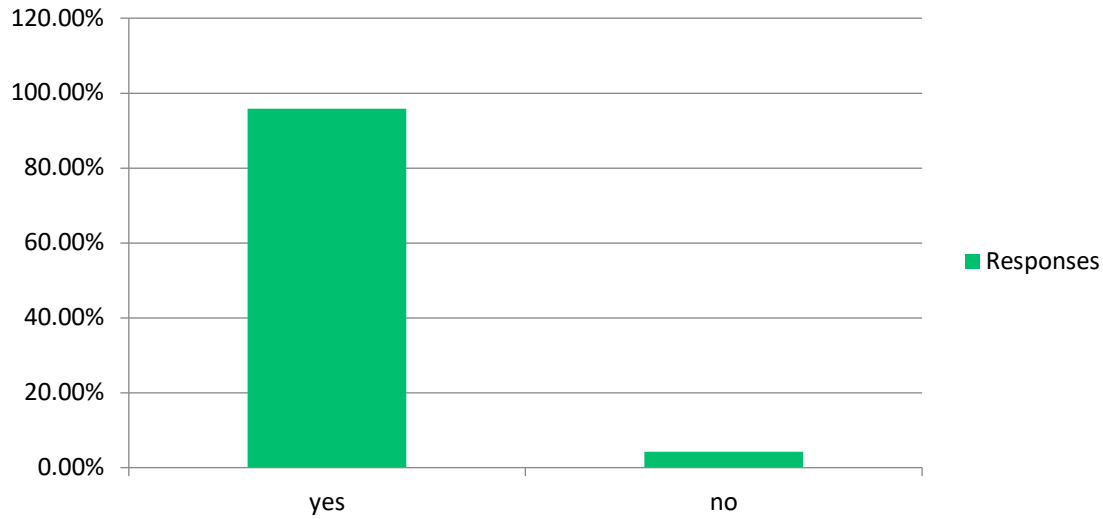
Did you achieve, or will you have achieved upon completing your studies, the goals you had when you started this course or program?



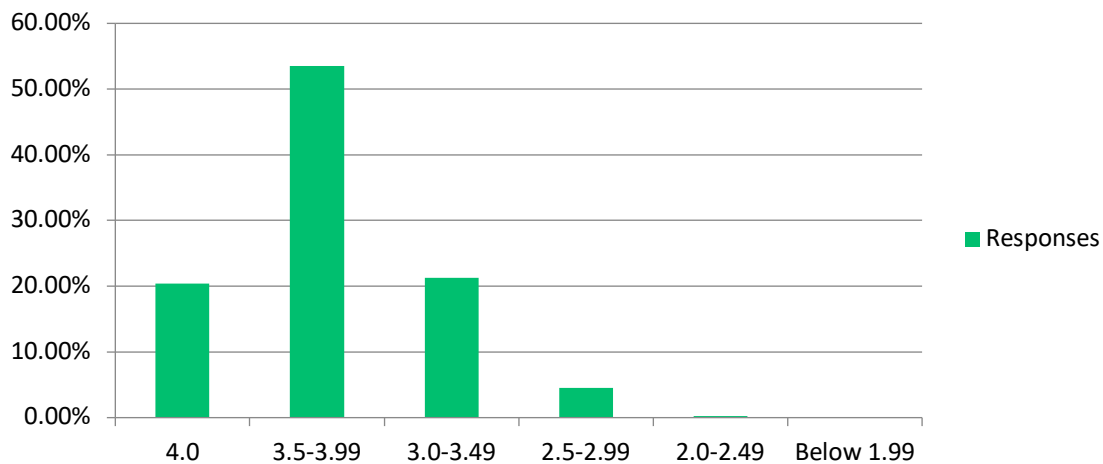

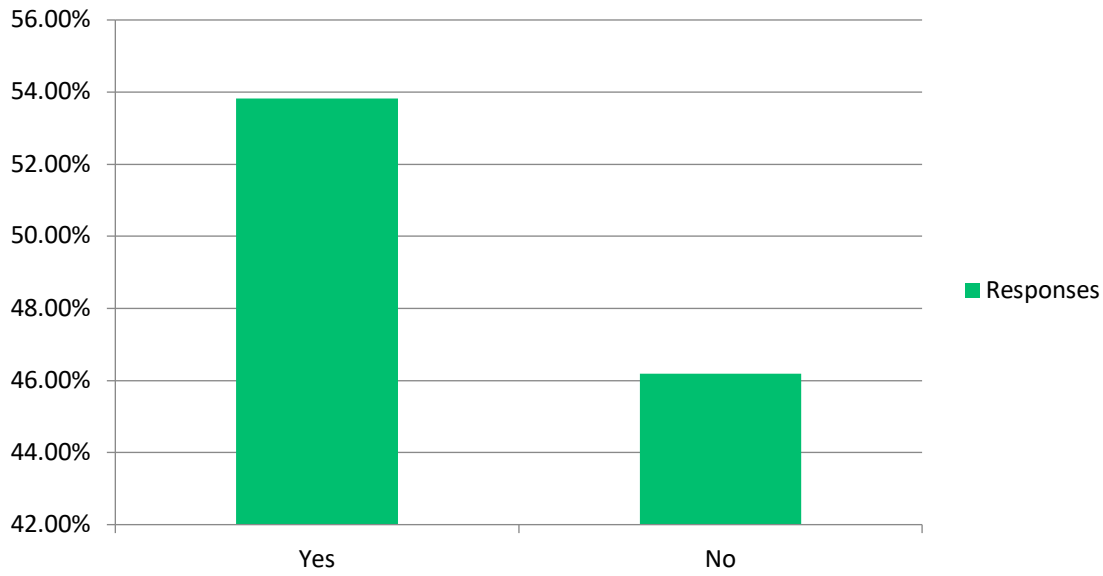

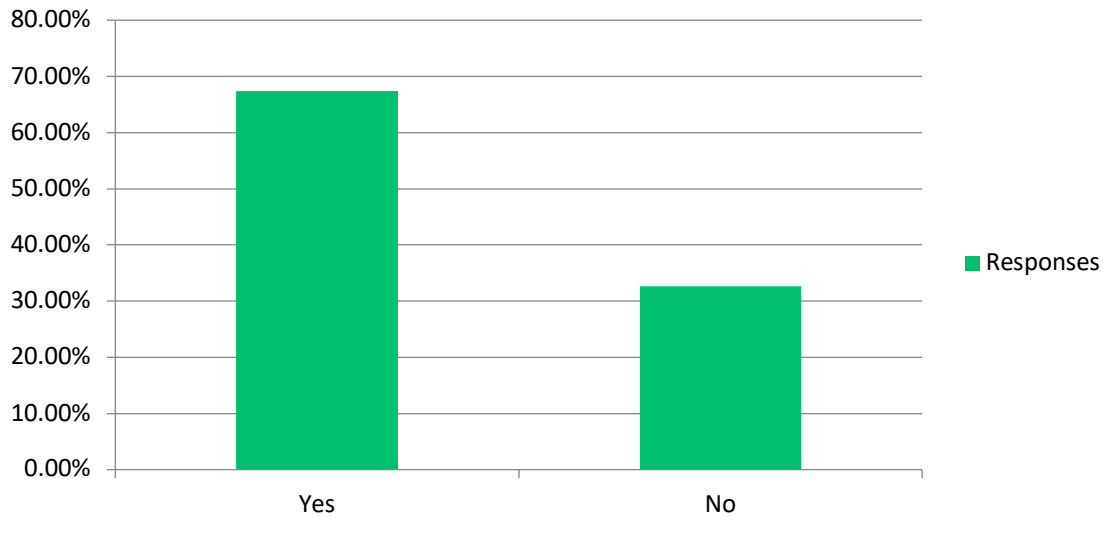
What is your best estimate of your overall grade-point average (GPA) at Doral College?



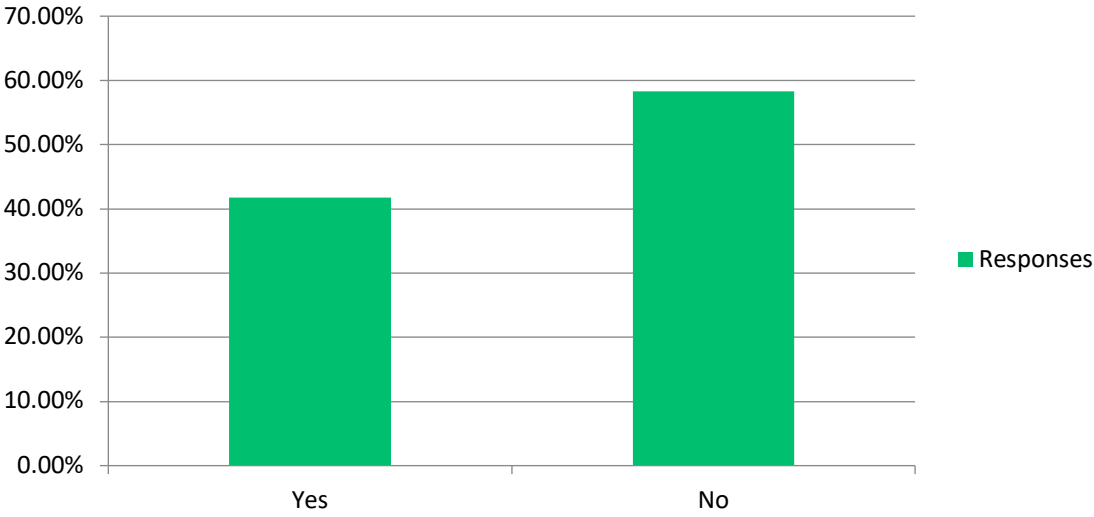
Did either of your parents attend college?



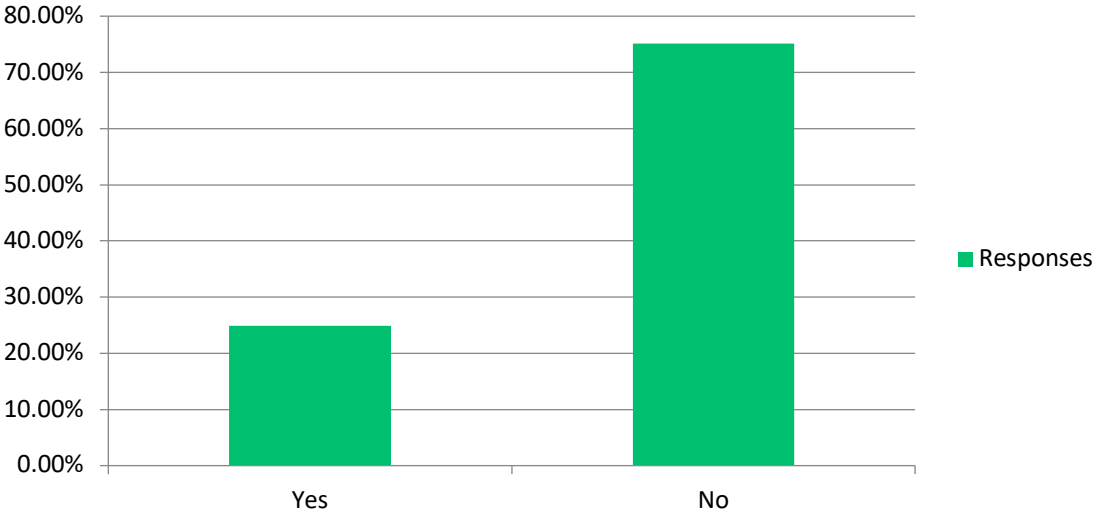
Do you qualify for free or reduced lunch at your affiliated high school?



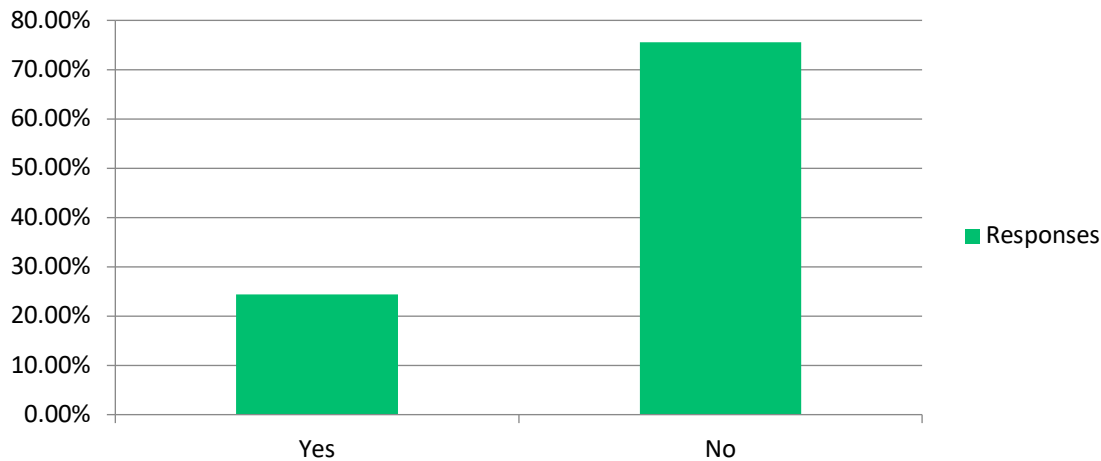
Would you be interested in appearing in a Doral College alumni directory?



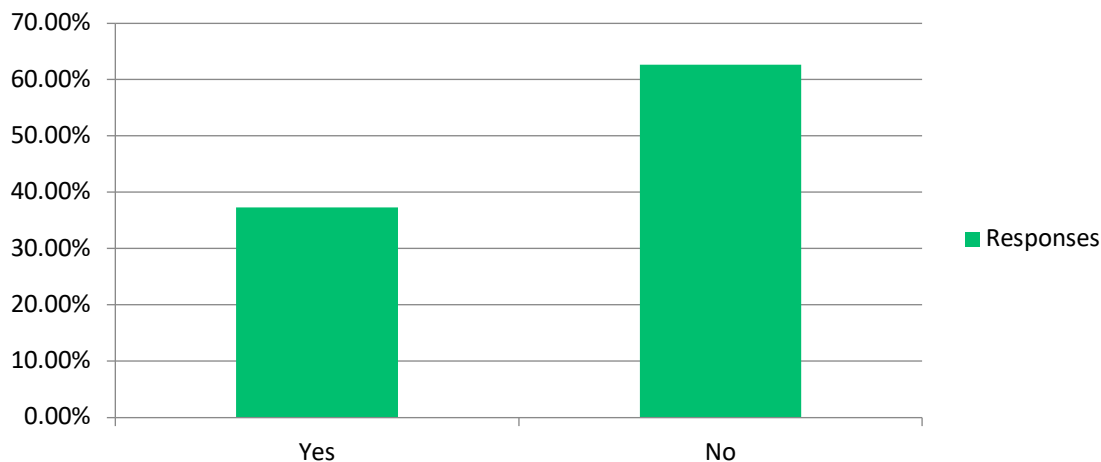
