The College's Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education will equip you with the knowledge and skills necessary to begin a career in elementary education. The program is FLDOE-approved, and leads to a Professional Educator's Certificate in grades K-6 with endorsements in Reading and ESOL. This approval ensures graduates of the program emerge ready to succeed in the elementary classroom setting so their students can do the same.

While this is a two-year academic program for students entering with an Associate in Arts*, Students who do not yet meet that requirement can begin with the College's A.A. program and articulate directly to the B.S. degree.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

1. Hold an AA degree OR 60 credit hours of lower division coursework (36 general education and 24 electives courses); minimum GPA of 2.5 or higher required;
2. Have completed of the following lower division prerequisites with a minimum grade of "C":
 - **EDF 2005:** Introduction to the Education Profession
 - **EME 2040:** Introduction to Technology for Educators or acceptable Substitute
 - **EDP 2002:** Educational Psychology or acceptable substitute
3. Have demonstrated mastery of general knowledge by passing all subtests of the General Knowledge Test of the Florida Teacher Certification Examination to include:
 - Essay
 - English Language Skills
 - Reading
 - Mathematics
4. Complete the application process, including signing an enrollment agreement.
