To ensure you have the best possible experience with us, please keep the following guidelines in mind:

- First-time participants must apply for admission to Doral College in addition to registering for courses on Frontline. To apply, visit https://doral.edu/apply.
- Frontline is a separate portal from Doral College's systems utilized by DLI to maintain professional learning records. As a result, selecting courses on Frontline begins the course registration process, but does not automatically enroll you in the selected courses. Enrollment requests are manually completed on the College end after the Frontline registration window has closed. For assistance with Frontline registration, DLI participants should reach out to their school's professional learning liaison.
- DLI participants should review and familiarize themselves with the DLI Policies and Procedures found at https://doral.edu/dli prior to registering for courses to ensure a smooth registration process.
- DLI participants who wish to drop a course after the Frontline registration period has closed must email the DC Student Affairs Help Desk at studentaffairs@doral.edu with their request, as indicated in the DLI Policies and Procedures, to ensure they are properly dropped. Students should submit these requests by published deadlines.
- Doral College awards academic credit rather than master plan points. For the purposes of recertification, one (1) college credit is equal 20 master plan points. (MPPs). Credit earned will be reflected on your college transcript, which may be ordered via the College website, but will not appear as master plan points on Frontline.

Alongside this note, we have published a list of important dates and tentative course offerings for each term throughout the year. Please remember that all offerings are subject change and depend on enrollment minimums. For the most up-to-date course information, always refer to the offerings published in Frontline.
